PAPAL VISIT TO CANADA

THE VATICAN HAS CONFIRMED the program of the Papal Visit to Canada, July 24-29, 2022! The Holy Father will travel within Alberta (based in Edmonton) from July 24-27, followed by a visit to Quebec City and Ste. Anne-de-Beaupre, July 27-29. Pope Francis will visit Iqaluit, Nunavut, the afternoon of July 29th, before returning to Rome. Drawing on the theme, "Walking Together", the Holy Father's journey of reconciliation, healing and hope includes visits to a former residential school, Indigenous pilgrimage sites, two public Masses and mix of public and private events. Free tickets will be available for a limited number of events, all of which will be broadcast and accessible via livestream. BIRTHDAY SUNDAY & WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & ELDERLY

To celebrate the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly and the July birthday celebrants, we invite you to join us for a cake and coffee on Sunday, July 24th, after the 9 am mass.



July 24, 2022

The theme for the day is "In old age they will still bear fruit" (Psalm 92:15).



Pope Francis stated the following as he presented his catechesis on the elderly:

"I wish to emphasize that the tenderness of the elderly and grandparents shows us the tenderness of God.Watch how a grandfather or a grandmother look at their grandchildren, how they embrace their grandchildren – that tenderness, free of any human distress, that has conquered the trials of life and is able to give love freely, the loving nearness of one person to others. This is what God is like, He knows how to embrace. And old age helps us understand this aspect of God who is tenderness. Old age moves ahead toward its destination, towards God's heaven. Old age therefore, is a special time of separating the future from the illusion of a biological and robotic survival, especially because it opens us to the tenderness of God's creative and generative womb.

May the spirit grant us the re-opening of this spiritual and cultural – mission of old age that reconciles us with the birth from above. When we think of old age like this, we can say – why has this throw-away culture decided to throw out the elderly, considering them useless? The elderly are the messengers of the future, the elderly are the messengers of tenderness, the elderly are the messengers of the wisdom of lived experience. Let us move forward and watch the elderly."

GRANDPARENTS MATTER!

Grandparents have a special role in their grandchildren's lives because they share a special bond of love that isn't marred by the day-day events that can sometimes stress families. Grandparents delight in their grandchildren and develop a special and unique connection with them. It is no wonder someone developed the bumper sticker that states, "If I'd known grandchildren were so much fun I would have had them first! Pope Francis knows that grandparents play an essential role in the lives of children. And he knows this by experience thanks to the love of his grandmother Rosa. This is how he explained it in a catechesis dedicated to grandparents in March of 2015:"The words of grandparents contain something special for young people. And they know it. The words that my grandmother gave me in writing the day of my priestly ordination I still carry with me, always, in the breviary. And I read them often and they do me good."
