

2021 Annual Report is the annual Statement of Income and Expenses for 2021 which is available for pick in the foyer.

The Covid-19 pandemic continued with its challenges in 2021. Revenue in 2021 was up slightly over 2020 thanks to our new lease contract with Bell.

As a result of the good response to the One Heart-One Soul program we were able to pay down \$130,000. of our \$240,000. Diocesan loan in 2021.

During 2022 we anticipate some recovery in income. Also, thanks to the One-Heart-One Soul program we will be able to complete the final \$110,000. payment on our loan this year. The program also provided funding allowing us to complete the outstanding One Heart-One Soul projects this year.
