St. Clare of Assisi's "Uno due, tre stella (1,2,3, star!)"

As we learned today, St. Clare of Assisi was born in Italy. It was where her journey all began as a little girl growing up. As a child who grew up playing with the other kids while being part of a wealthy family.

The children in Italy have some games that they like to play. Here is one of them. It's similar to "What Time is it Mr. Fox" but in italy they're version is called "Uno due, tre stella (1,2,3, star!)".

Here's how to play:

- 1. Choose who is going to be "it". They stand at the other end of the room and are now at the finish line.
- 2. The other children will stand at a distance away from the child who is "it" and is now at the start line.
- 3. The child who is "it" says "Uno due, tre stella (1,2,3, star!)", turns around and searches for the children who are moving.
- 4. When he sees someone moving he then calls out "Ti ho visto (I see you!)".
- 5. The moving children then return to the start line
- 6. The game is over when the other players touch the child who is "it".
- 7. Have fun!
